Recently retired as the appointed Chief of Police for a community of 12,000 residents and a service population of over 25,000. Operated an annual budget of 4 million dollars. Oversaw a staff of 41 employees, including 30 sworn members and eleven civilian employees. Restructured the police department to enhance the mission, vision, and level of positive community engagement following a high-profile incident, which caused distrust of the department before my arrival. Established a Citizen Liaison Committee to help bridge the gap between the community members and the police department. Created opportunities for advanced training, equipment, technology, accreditation, recruitment, and retention. Invested heavily in technology to lower operating costs, and rebuilt the communications center. Successfully engaged with the community and area partners to reduce violent crimes and provide services to those in need. Effectively managed several high profile events and incidents by proactively utilizing social media, mainstream media, and ensuring transparency.


